The Board has elected to establish an IADT award entitled the ***Jens Ove Andreasen Lifetime Achievement Award in Dental Traumatology***. This occasional award is to be presented to a member of the Association who has demonstrated exceptional dedication to Dental Traumatology and to the IADT over many years. It is not expect that the award of this honor to be a regular event, but that it be presented infrequently and only to those members of the Association who were considered to have made major contributions to leadership, research and education in Dental Traumatology over a long period of time.

The Board also agreed to establish an Honors and Awards Committee whose role will be to formulate guidelines for selecting candidates for IADT awards.



The Board considers that Jens Ove Andreasen has made an immense and extraordinary contribution to the science of Dental Traumatology and to the global knowledge about Dental Traumatology over his lifetime and that this contribution should be recognized in a special way by awarding him the first ***Jens Ove Andreasen Lifetime Achievement Award in Dental Traumatology.***

Report from the Executive Director



This past year has seen more activity taking place with respect the IADT than perhaps no other year in before. It started with the IADT participating in the AEEDC Conference in Dubai in February 2011 and promoting membership in the IADT in that part of the world. The AEEDC conference is the third largest dental conference in the world and our Association's involvement in lecture program was particularly well received. Directors and members, headed by Lamar Hicks, manned an information booth throughout the conference.

It then followed with writing an update on the popular IADT Guidelines for Traumatic Dental Injuries (previously updated in 2007). That was a big effort on the part of the various IADT committee members who spent countless hours collecting and reviewing the tremendous amount of material currently available to be able to include all the current information. All three sections have now been published in the Journal - the last one on Primary Teeth being published in this issue.

We also conducted an election in 2011 for membership on the IADT Board of Directors. The size of the Board was reduced to 11 from 15 directors to better streamline the activities of the IADT and keep the cost of running the organization within the budgetary parameters of a small organization such as the IADT. The new Board, which took office January 1, 2012, will serve for two years.

Another major activity was the decision to contract with **RES, Inc** to manage the administrative affairs of the IADT. This management group, with its president Eben Yancey, has extensive experience for over 20 years in providing administrative support for organizations such as the IADT. Some of their other clients are the Academy of Prosthodontics, the International College of Prosthodontics, and the American Academy of Maxillofacial Prosthetics.

The website is www.res-inc.com and the office is located in San Diego, which makes my interactions with the group very convenient. I am sure if you have accessed the IADT website you have noticed many changes including an improvement on the logo and other aspects of the site.

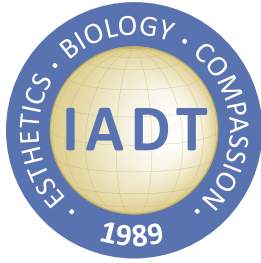
