The IADT would like to thank and commend Prof Abbott for his outstanding job as the EIC, leading the journal to new heights with high quality papers and commentary and a significantly increased impact factor. His dedication and hard work were paramount to the continued success of the journal.

Reflections on Being the Editor-in-Chief Paul Abbott



'The December issue of Dental Traumatology will be my last issue as the Editor-in-Chief after seven years in this role. It has been a real privilege to serve the profession in this way and I have thoroughly enjoyed it.

The Editor-in-Chief's role is a complex one – especially in such a multidisciplinary area as Dental Traumatology, which brings together all of the specialties of dentistry. At first, it seemed like a rather daunting task to have to understand and adjudicate papers from all the other specialties outside my own field of Endodontics. However, I have been

very fortunate in having a great team of Associate Editors throughout my tenure. Each Associate Editor has been not only a specialist but a true expert in their specific disciplines – so my job was easier than I first imagined!! I quickly became very confident in following their suggestions and recommendations to accept, revise or reject manuscripts. In addition, there have been many, many other experts working as Reviewers for the journal. These people analyse each manuscript and provide very valuable comments – which may be criticism or praise – to the Associate Editors, the Editor-in-Chief and ultimately as feedback to the authors. All of the Associate Editors and Reviewers volunteer their valuable time to help the journal become a major source of up-to-date research and to present reviews of clinical recommendations, quidelines and case reports.

Of course, the authors deserve a special mention. Without authors submitting manuscripts, there would simply be no journal! Apart from this, and more importantly, the authors must be appreciated for their research or clinical cases and for taking the time to share with us. I tell my students that a research project is not completed until you have shared the findings with as many people as possible and the best way to do this is through publishing in a reputable journal. There is no point in just a handful of people knowing what you have done – you should aim to be as wide reaching as possible in spreading your findings and new knowledge.

Although the role as Editor-in-Chief has been quite demanding at times, one of the fantastic benefits of being an Editor is the very timely exposure to a wide range of information in the various manuscripts – that is, I get to see papers many months before they become publicly available as Accepted Articles or Early View articles on the journal's website. This has been a small, but much appreciated, reward for the work involved in being the Editor. It improved and strengthened my knowledge which I could then incorporate into my teaching and clinical practice much earlier than others could.

The journal has steadily grown in stature and rankings (such as impact factors, citation rates, etc.) throughout its history since the first issue was published in February 1985. Since then, there have been four people serve as Editor-in-Chief – Prof. Leif Tronstad (1985-2000), Prof. Martin Trope (2001-2006), Prof. Lars Andersson (2007-2015) and me (2016-2022). My three predecessors set this journal up as a world-class journal and the "go to" journal for all aspects of dental traumatology. I hope I have been able to maintain this over the last seven years.

In 2022, we are publishing volume 38 with six (bi-monthly) issues. Typically, each issue has 12-15 articles. Hence, Dental Traumatology is not a large journal, but I believe it is a "quality journal" that has very valuable information about the many aspects of dental traumatology. Our articles are widely cited in other leading dental journals and sometimes even medical journals. In 2020, the journal reached its highest ever ranking (27 out of 91 journals in the Dentistry, Oral Surgery & Medicine category), its highest Impact Factor (3.333) and its highest number of citations (3,680). In 2021, the journal scored its highest 5-year Impact Factor (2.849) and its highest Impact Factor Without Self Citations (2.469). These numbers have all steadily increased over the last 20 years since the journal changed its name from Endodontics & Dental Traumatology to Dental Traumatology. These metrics indicate the journal's standing and respect within the profession. They also show the journal's growth and development over the years and reflect the size and number of articles that we publish - but more importantly, they reflect the hard work and dedication of numerous people over many years. Importantly, it is not the Editor-in-Chief who achieves these scores – it is the entire journal and everyone who contributes to it. I am confident that the journal will continue to see increases in all these metrics over the coming years.

The time has come for me to move on and relinquish the role of Editor-in-Chief. In some ways, I will be sad to do so, but I am also happy knowing that I have enjoyed the last seven years. I have learnt a lot, I have made new friends and I have met many people who have helped me and the journal. Thank you to everyone involved and I wish my successor* all the very best for a successful term as the new Editor-in-Chief of Dental Traumatology.

Below are links to the first 3 Life Member Memoirs that have been published in newsflashes and on the IADT website. Five additional memoirs will be posted over the next few months.












3) 22nd World Congress on Dental Traumatology (WCDT 2024)
